

FLAGSHIP SPECIES

The Ambohitantely Special Reserve ensures the representation of the central terrestrial ecoregion. The Reserve is home to a **palm species**, the *Dypsis* oropedionis, which requires particular attention given its status within the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and the pressures weighing on it. This palm is also among the conservation targets of the Protected Area (PA).

LANDSCAPES AND HABITATS



Mid-altitude dense moistevergreen forest, swamp forest, rocky vegetation, secondary grasslands.

PRESSURES AND THREATS



Thicketfires, hunting, illegal logging of trees and semi-precious stone.

ECONOMIC VALUE

The PA plays the role of regulating the water cycle that irrigates the surrounding area.



LOCAL COMMUNITIES INITIATIVES

Like all PAs managed by MNP, the management of the Ambohitantely Special Reserve is a collaborative co-management with the participation of members of local communities in conservation and development activities. They are brought together in the CLPs (Local Park Committees) and COSAPs (Orientation and Support of Protected **Areas Committees).**
