FLAGSHIP SPECIES

The park mainly houses a mid-altitude dense moistevergreen forest. Despite its small size, it has a high biological diversity for both fauna and flora. **135** SPECIES OF BIRDS including 6 endangered (e.g. Madagascar grebe) and 8 vulnerable species (e.g. Madagascar red owl, Madagascar rail)



12 SPECIES OF LEMURS

including **3** critically endangered (e.g. *Indri indri*), **2** endangered (e.g. Aye-aye), and **6** vulnerable species



59 SPECIES

OF REPTILES including 1 locally endemic, 1 critically endangered, 2 endangered, and 2 vulnerable species





12 SPECIES OF BATS including 2 vulnerable species (e.g. Madagascar flying fox).



64 SPECIES OF AMPHIBIANS

including 2 locally endemic, 1 of which is endangered, 4 others endangered, and 2 vulnerable



5 SPECIES OF CARNIVORANS including 3 vulnerable

PROTECTED AREA SPECIFICITIES

LANDSCAPES AND HABITATS



Mid-altitude evergreen dense moistevergreen forest, secondary forest.

PRESSURES AND THREATS



Deforestation for shifting cultivation and land grabbing, fires, illegal logging, collection of non-timber forest products.



ECONOMIC VALUE

It is a source of revenues and represents an employment opportunity for local communities and private operators through ecotourism.

LOCAL COMMUNITIES

Like all the Protected Areas (PAs) managed by MNP, **the management of the Analamazaotra National Park** is a **collaborative co-management** with the participation of members of local communities in conservation and development activities. They are brought together in the CLPs (Local Park Committees) and COSAPs (Orientation and Support of Protected Areas Committees).
